

GUIDELINES FOR WRITING A CRITICAL REVIEW

1. Introduction to the author and the work

- Introduction of the author.
- Identification of the audience and motivations
- Overall framework surrounding the work.

2. Exposure of the document (critical summary)

- Identification of the topic.
- Identification of key points.
- Identification of conclusions.

3. Internal review

- Does the author state the problems in a clear and scientific way?
- Do the solution or conclusions logically derive from the argumentation?
- Does the presentation of the material meet the commonly accepted standards?

4. External review

- Assessment of how the text develops the topic.
- Assessment of the text's originality, relevance, topicality, interest, importance, etc.
- Potential analysis on how the work is received by the target audience.

5. Overall rating/Conclusion

- Assessment of the work's major merits and weaknesses.
- Assessment of the work's general appeal.
- Personal opinions, comments.
